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Commodities Update:

- Panels: As of this writing both OSB and SYP plywood seem to be holding steady. OSB has strong order files, and with steady demand, has not lost much ground. Pretty much the same thing for Yellow Pine plywood.
- Dimension lumber: Euro SPF has had steady sales but with most orders shipping two weeks or sooner, has not been able to generate much upward movement.
- USG, our primary gypsum vendor, has taken a \$20/MSF increase on drywall which will be passed on soon. Its cement board, joint compound and plaster products will not increase as previously announced.
- USG Interiors has increased ceiling grid this past month by 15% and has another 10% bump planned for 2/26/24 due to higher steel costs. Ceiling panels will increase by 8% on 2/12/24.
- Steel studs and accessories from Clark Dietrich will also increase 10% on 2/1/24.
- Fiberglass and glass wool (Rockwool) insulation are still in very tight supply.

Helpful hint:

What to do if joint compound freezes before it is used.

United States Gypsum Company urges dealers and end users of its SHEETROCK Brand Ready Mixed Joint Compound products to protect them from freezing. Frozen compound usually requires extra labor to retain its desired working properties. If joint compound freezes, thaw the containers slowly at room temperature. High heat or the addition of hot water is not recommended.

The end user may notice separated liquid lying on top of the frozen compound. This liquid must be mixed back into the compound. No water should be added to the compound to achieve the desired consistency until the separated liquid has been re-mixed. If the material can't be remixed to a uniform homogenous consistency, the product should be discarded.
